

# Eviction Prevention Rent Assistance

This rent assistance program is different than the pandemic relief rent assistance programs (ERAP and T-RAP) from the past few years. This program is permanently funded through state legislation.

## How to access the program

### Step 1

Request program intake at the organization listed below that best fits your description.

### Step 2

A case manager will get back to you to determine your eligibility for screening.

### Step 3

Participate in client screening to determine your risk of homelessness.

### Step 4

If your screening results meet the priority threshold for the program and funding is available, you will be enrolled as a client to receive rent assistance and a housing stability case manager.

### Households eligible for screening must:

- be behind on rent.
  - have a low or medium income.
- and**
- be willing to participate in housing stability planning with a case manager.

### What is the client screening?

The program funding requires a specific screening tool is used to prioritize serving those who are the highest risks for homelessness.

Not every eligible applicant will become a client of this program.
