Outbreak of Suspected Fungal Meningitis in Matamoros, Mexico

Actions Requested:

Be aware of patients who underwent procedures using epidural anesthesia in Matamoros, Mexico and have developed signs and symptoms of possible meningitis.

- Clinics reported thus far: River Side Surgical Center and Clinica K-3
- Signs and Symptoms: fever, headache, stiff neck, nausea, vomiting, photophobia, altered mental status
- Patients who have underwent a procedure under epidural anesthesia in Matamoros, Mexico after January 1st, 2023, and show signs of suspected fungal meningitis, providers should perform brain imaging (CT or MRI) and a diagnostic lumbar puncture if there is no contraindication.
- Consider ordering bacterial and fungal cultures of CSF
- Consider ordering serum and CSF levels of (1,3)-beta-D-glucan
- Consider ordering serum and CSF Aspergillus galactomannan and PCR testing
- If suspected, treatment involving broad-spectrum antifungal medications that have adequate central nervous system penetration should begin as soon as possible following CSF collection
- Consultation with infection disease specialist is recommended

<u>Suspected fungal meningitis cases should be immediately reported to Thurston County Public Health</u> or Washington Department of Health

Background:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has released information on an outbreak of suspected fungal meningitis cases. This outbreak is among U.S. patients that have undergone cosmetic procedures in the city of Matamoros in Tamaulipas, Mexico that utilized epidural anesthesia. The causative organism for the outbreak has not been identified yet but at least one of the patients are displaying elevated fungal biomarker (1,3)-beta-D-glucan in their cerebrospinal fluid. All 5 patients have been hospitalized in Texas; one has died as of May 12th, 2023.
