Map Example 2: ADU Minimization

Minimization means to reduce the amount of federally-protected species habitat your project impacts.

THREE WAYS MINIMIZATION IS SHOWN ON THIS MAP

1. Square Footage Before & After Minimization is noted.


The initial square footage of ground disturbance caused by adding the accessory dwelling unit at the bottom left of the parcel, and septic about 300 feet above it on the map is noted (60,350 sf). Moving the septic closer to the ADU, minimized or reduced the square footage of ground disturbance to 2,679 sf, which is noted.

2. HCP BMPs are listed.

The HCP best management practices (BMPs) used for this project are listed on the map. The HCP Project Review application lists all the BMPs, and requires you to answer which ones you will use on your project. Simply note which BMPs you use.

3. Minimization is highlighted.

A yellow highlighter line is drawn to indicate the initial proposal area with the larger area of ground disturbance. The minimized or reduced area of impact is drawn on the map with a green highlighter.
