

Potential Recommendations Related to Outreach to Partner Agencies and Constituencies

Developed by the Outreach/Education Subcommittee to the SSWAB

1. Increase participation with regional partners (WS DOT, WS Dept. of Health, Thurston Regional Planning Council, WS Dept. of Ecology, and local partners). SSWAB member(s) should be linked to Ecology and other partner's informational websites to expand ideas as we work to find solutions to common problems.
2. Educate and provide materials to SSWAB "consultants" so they can be more effective in serving local HOA's or constituents who may be dealing with storm-water related issues. Create a traveling presentation packet for SSWAB members.
3. Create a "CONTACT A SSWAB" member link on the website. Drainage complaints could be an opportunity for SSWAB engagement with communities. When a request for SSWAB consultation comes from the website, it could be forwarded to all SSWAB members as it may relate specifically to an issue in a SSWAB members represented area.
4. Use JOLT (Journal of Olympia, Lacey, Tumwater) to regularly publish storm water/water quality stories. Assign a member of SSWAB to be conduit for these articles.
