RESOLUTION NO. 634

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Olympia School District No. 111, Thurston County, Washington, providing for the submission to the qualified electors of the district at a special election to be held therein on February 8, 2022 of a proposition to authorize the district to levy an additional tax to provide a total of \$52,427,000 for the District's Capital Projects Fund for developing, acquiring and installing computer technology, related technology infrastructure, providing training in the application and implementation of said technology and administrative expenses, green energy investments and school and systems safety improvements, such levies to be made for four years commencing in 2022 for collection in the school years from 2022-23 through 2026-2027, inclusive.

WHEREAS, the technology equipment, related technology infrastructure, equipment and facilities of Olympia School District No. 111, Thurston County, Washington (the "District"), are in need of improvements, expansion, renovation, and construction to meet the current and future educational programs for its students to support increased student access to technology, preparing students for college and careers now and into the future; and

WHEREAS, the District is currently collecting a technology and capital projects levy pursuant to Resolution No. 564 and approved by the District's electors on February 13, 2018 (the "2018 Levy Authorization"); and

WHEREAS, funds available to the District from the 2018 Levy Authorization and other sources will be insufficient to enable the District to implement such projects on an on-going basis; and

WHEREAS, in order to support the cost of these projects as found necessary by the Board of Directors, it is deemed advisable that the District impose and extend a tax levy upon all the taxable property within the District in excess of the annual tax the District is permitted by law to

levy without a vote of the people, such levy to be made for four years commencing in 2022 for collection in the school years from 2022-23 through 2026-2027, inclusive, inclusive, as authorized by Article VII, Section 2 of the State Constitution and RCW 84.52.053; and

WHEREAS, the question of whether or not such excess tax may be levied must be submitted to the qualified electors of the District for their ratification or rejection; and

WHEREAS, the conditions here and above set forth requires the holding of a special election in the District;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF OLYMPIA SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 111, THURSTON COUNTY, WASHINGTON as follows:

Section 1. Finding. It is hereby found and declared that the welfare of the students and other residents of the District requires the District to carry out the improvements hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Authorization of Improvements. The District shall continue to modernize District facilities through the acquisition, development, installation, and implementation of computer technology and technology systems, facilities and projects, including but not limited to enhancing infrastructure, acquiring hardware, licensing software, and implementing online applications and training related to the installation of the foregoing as an integral part of the District's technology systems, facilities, or projects; and the application and modernization of technology systems for operations and instruction and capital administrative expenses to support the instructional program of the District, including, but not limited to, the ongoing fees for online applications, subscriptions, or software licenses, including upgrades and incidental services, and ongoing training related to the installation and integration of these products or services in the classroom and District operations, green energy investments and facility and systems safety

improvements, and shall make other capital project expenditures as found necessary by the Board of Directors. In addition, the District shall make other necessary capital equipment purchases and facility and systems improvements to modernize District facilities and safety systems such as new camera and emergency notification systems.

The District may repay any obligations hereafter incurred for the foregoing purposes.

If available funds are sufficient, the District shall acquire, construct, equip and make other capital improvements to the facilities of the District, all as the Board of Directors finds necessary provided that such funds may be used only to support the construction, modernization, replacement, and remodeling of school facilities and safe routes to school or implementation of the District's technology facilities and systems plan. Further, the District shall acquire and make facility improvements to infrastructure to withstand emergencies and generate sustainable power.

If the District shall determine that it has become impracticable to accomplish any of such improvements or portions thereof by reason of changed conditions or needs, incompatible development, costs substantially in excess of those estimated, or acquisition by a superior governmental authority, the District shall not be required to accomplish such improvement and may apply levy proceeds as set forth in this section. If any or all of the improvements have been completed, or their completion duly provided for, or their completion found to be impractical, the District may apply the levy proceeds or any portion thereof to other portions of the improvements or to other capital purposes of the District, as the District in its discretion shall determine.

Notwithstanding any provision of this resolution to the contrary, levy proceeds may only be used to support the construction, modernization or remodeling of school facilities or implementation of the District's technology facilities and systems plan.

Section 3. Authorization of Levies. It is hereby found and declared that the best interests on the District require the submission to the qualified electors of the District of the proposition whether the District shall make the Capital Projects Fund levies for their ratification or rejection at a special election to be held on February 8, 2022. For the purpose of providing funds necessary for the needs described in Section 2 above, the Thurston County Auditor, as *ex officio* supervisor of elections in Thurston County, is hereby requested to call and conduct such special election to be held within the District on such day and to submit to the qualified electors of the District for their approval or rejection, a proposition providing for tax levies for the Capital Projects Fund for four years, commencing in 2022, producing dollar amounts at estimated tax rates per thousand dollars of assessed value to produce such amounts, in excess of the maximum amount tax levy permitted by law to be levied within the District without a vote of the electors, all as follows:

- A. \$11,887,000, said levy to be made in 2022 for collection in 2023;
- B. \$13,314,000, said levy to be made in 2023 for collection in 2024;
- C. \$12,875,000, said levy to be made in 2024 for collection in 2025; and
- D. \$14,351,000, said levy to be made in 2025 for collection in 2026.

The estimated levy rate depends upon the final dollar amount of assessed value of the property within the District. At this time, based upon information provided by the County Assessor's office, the estimated levy rate for the 2022 levy is \$0.92 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, the estimated levy rate for the 2023 levy is \$0.98 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, the estimated levy rate for the 2024 levy is \$0.90 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, and the estimated levy rate for the 2025 levy is \$0.94 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation. The exact levy rate shall be adjusted based upon the actual assessed value of the property within the District at the time of the levy.

Section 4. Approval of Form of Ballot. The Secretary of the Board of Directors is hereby authorized and directed to certify said proposition to the Thurston County Auditor, as *ex officio* supervisor of elections in Thurston County, substantially in the following form:



The District understands and agrees that it will be required to pay its proportionate share of the expenses of the voters' pamphlet.



### EXPLANATORY STATEMENT - PROPOSITION NO. 1

Passage of this proposition would authorize Olympia School District No. 111 to continue a four-year technology and capital projects levy to support increased student access to technology, preparing students for college and careers now and into the future, and fund safety projects districtwide. This proposed replacement levy is not a new tax; it would re-authorize the District's existing technology and capital projects levy, which expires in 2022.

Passage would allow the levy of \$11,887,000 for collection in 2023, the levy of \$13,314,000 for collection in 2024, the levy of \$12,875,000 for collection in 2025, and the levy of \$14,351,000 for collection in 2026 to replace an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District. If authorized by voters, estimated levy rates per \$1,000 of assessed value would be \$0.92 (2023 collection); \$0.98 (2024 collection); \$0.90 (2025 collection); and \$0.94 (2026 collection). The exact levy rate shall be adjusted based upon the actual assessed value of the property within the District at the time of the replacement levy.
