How To Mark Your Ballot



Fill in the oval to the left of your desired selection. Use a dark ink pen. Do not use a pencil or gel pen.



If You Make A Mistake

Do not erase any selection made in error. If you make a mistake, draw a line through the entire candidate's name.

If you wish to vote for another candidate, fill in the oval to the left of your chosen candidate.

More than one vote for an office or measure will be an overvote, and no votes for that office or measure will be counted. You do not have to vote in every race.

Write-in Votes: To vote for a person not on the ballot, write the name on the line provided, then fill in the oval to the left of the write-in line.

Return Your Ballot: Follow the instructions on the envelopes and colored insert. Remember to sign and date the voter's affidavit on the return envelope.

READ: Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

Proposition No. 1
Levy for Fire Safety and Emergency Management Purposes**

The City Council of the City of Olympia adopted Ordinance 6707 concerning property taxes for fire safety and emergency management purposes. To finance fire safety and emergency management operations and improvements, this proposition would increase the City’s regular property tax levy to a total authorized rate of not to exceed \$2.218 per \$1,000 (an estimated increase of \$0.25 per \$1,000 over the current levy) of assessed valuation for collection beginning 2011 and to use the 2011 levy amount to recalculate subsequent levy limits.
