

# Thurston County Sample Ballot

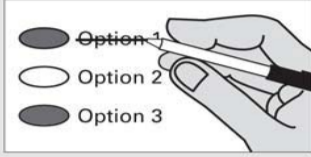
## **i** Instructions

### Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.  
Use a dark blue or black ink pen. Do not use a pencil or gel pen.  
Vote for one. If you vote for more than one, no votes for that candidate race or response will be counted.

### Correcting A Mistake



Do not erase any selection made in error. If you make a mistake, draw a line through the entire candidate's name or response.  
If you wish to vote for another candidate or response, fill in the oval to the left of your corrected candidate or response.

### Optional Write-In

To add a candidate, fill in the oval provided to the left of "write-in" and print the name on the line.

### Additional Information

Read all instructions in your ballot packet.  
Remember to sign and date the voter's affidavit on the return envelope.  
For a replacement ballot, please contact the Thurston County Auditor's Office at (360) 786-5408.  
Deposit your ballot in a ballot drop box no later than 8:00 p.m. Election Day or mail using first class postage. It must be postmarked on or before Election Day.

This sample ballot contains all candidates and measures certified to appear on the August 16, 2011 Primary Election ballot. Be sure to follow all instructions on your actual ballot. Ballots will begin arriving on July 28, 2011. ## Thurston County Local Measures

**City of Tumwater Proposition No. 1**  
**Fire and Public Safety Levy Lid Lift**

The City Council has adopted Ordinance O2011-005 concerning a levy lid lift for public safety funding. If approved, this proposition would authorize an increased regular property tax levy in 2012-2017 for public safety purposes, including firefighters, police officers, public safety facilities and equipment. The 2012 levy rate would be \$2.945736/\$1,000 of assessed value, estimated to raise \$1,443,500 in 2012. The levy limits for 2013-2017 would be adjusted for inflation, measured by the consumer price index. The 2017 levy would be used to calculate future levy limits and future increases would be limited as provided by statute.

## Thurston County Local Measures

**Fire Protection District No. 15 (Munn Lake) Proposition No. 1**  
**Levy Lid Lift**

The Board of Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 15 adopted Resolution No. R2011.001 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would authorize an increase in regular property tax levies in 2012-2017 for fire protection services, equipment and facilities. The 2012 levy rate would be \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The limiting factor for calculating the 2013-2017 maximum levies would be the increase in inflation, measured by the consumer price index, as identified in the resolution. The 2017 levy limit shall be used to determine future levy limits.
