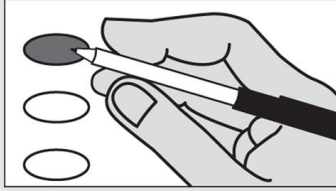


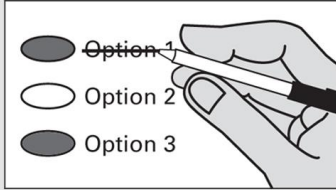
Sample Ballot Instructions

i Instructions



Marking Your Ballot

Use a dark pen. Vote for one. If you vote for more than one, that race or measure will not count. To vote for a candidate not on the ballot, print the name on the blank line and fill in the oval to the left.



Making A Correction

Draw a line through the entire candidate's name or response. To vote for another candidate or response, fill in the oval to the left of your new selection.

Additional Information

Sign and date the voter's declaration on the return envelope.

Return your ballot in a ballot drop box no later than 8:00 p.m. Election Day, or by mail (postmarked on or before Election Day).

Precinct Committee Officers (PCO): This office appears only on the Primary ballot if two candidates from the same party file for the same precinct. The names will appear in lot draw order. If only one person from a party files for a precinct they will be deemed elected at the close of filing and the office will not appear on the ballot. Write-ins are not permitted.

Voters may vote for only one candidate for PCO. If a voter votes for more than one candidate, the votes must be treated as overvotes. For the limited purpose of voting in a precinct committee officer election, a voter affiliates with a major political party when he or she votes for a candidate of that party.

Washington's Top Two Primary Election:

In each race, you may vote for any one candidate listed. The two candidates who receive the most votes in the August Primary will advance to the November General Election.

Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

Note: Not all of these candidates and measures will appear on your regular ballot. Your ballot will only contain the races and measures for which you are eligible to vote. Be sure to follow all instructions on your ballot.

READ: Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate’s preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 9 (McLane Black Lake)
Proposition No. 1
Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 9 (McLane Black Lake Fire Department) adopted Resolution No. 22-576 concerning a proposition to restore its regular property tax levy.

This proposition authorizes the District to restore its regular property tax levy to \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2022 and collected in 2023. The funds will maintain fire protection, and emergency medical services, apparatus and equipment, and provide for firefighter safety. The dollar amount of the 2022 levy collected in 2023 shall serve as the base for computing subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.

Your vote for a candidate affirms your affiliation with the same party as the candidate. This preference is private and will not be matched to your name or shared.
