

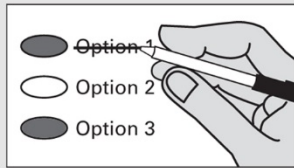
Sample Ballot Instructions

Marking Your Ballot

Use a dark pen. Vote for one. If you vote for more than one, that race or measure will not count. To vote for a candidate not on the ballot, print the name on the blank line and fill in the oval to the left.



Making A Correction

Draw a line through the entire candidate's name or response. To vote for another candidate or response, fill in the oval to the left of your new selection.

Additional Information

Sign and date the voter's declaration on the return envelope.

Return your ballot in a ballot drop box no later than 8:00 p.m. Election Day, or by mail (postmarked on or before Election Day).

**Griffin School District No. 324
 Proposition No. 1
 Property Improvements, Capital Projects and Technology Replacement Levy**

The Board of Directors of Griffin School District No. 324 adopted Resolution No. 21-22-02 concerning a school property improvements, capital projects and technology levy. The proposition authorizes continued modernization of facilities by implementing property, technology, school, and facilities improvements including application and infrastructure improvements for technology systems, safety, operations and instruction, and payments to Olympia School District for high school capital improvements; and authorizes the following excess levies for such purposes on all taxable property within the District:

 Technology and Capital Projects Replacement Levy**

The Board of Directors of Olympia School District passed Resolution No. 634 concerning this proposition for capital levies. This proposition authorizes the District to continue modernizing District facilities by acquiring, developing, installing, and implementing computer technology systems, and projects for operations and instruction, and other capital project expenditures to improve safety and energy sustainability, and authorizes the following excess levies for such purposes on all taxable property within the District:

This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, to upgrade building envelopes, HVAC, electrical, plumbing, safety and security systems, make energy efficiency/site improvements, conduct pre-construction activities, and improve technology equipment and infrastructure:

This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, to upgrade building envelopes, HVAC, electrical, plumbing, safety and security systems, make energy efficiency/site improvements, conduct pre-construction activities, and improve instructional technology equipment and infrastructure:
