

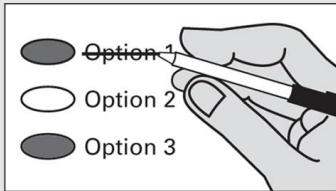
Sample Ballot Instructions

Marking Your Ballot

Use a dark pen. Vote for one. If you vote for more than one, that race or measure will not count. To vote for a candidate not on the ballot, print the name on the blank line and fill in the oval to the left.



Making A Correction

Draw a line through the entire candidate's name or response. To vote for another candidate or response, fill in the oval to the left of your new selection.

Additional Information

Sign and date the voter's declaration on the return envelope.

Return your ballot in a ballot drop box no later than 8:00 p.m. Election Day, or by mail (postmarked on or before Election Day).

If a primary election was held for an office, the two candidates who received the most votes in the Primary advanced to the General Election.

Note: Not all of these candidates and measures will appear on your regular ballot. Your ballot will only contain the races and measures for which you are eligible to vote. Be sure to follow all instructions on your ballot.

**Advisory Vote No. 36
Engrossed Second Substitute House Bill 1477**

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, a 988 behavioral health crisis response and suicide prevention tax on telephone lines, costing \$432,000,000 in its first ten years, for government spending.

This tax increase should be:

**Advisory Vote No. 37
Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5096**

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, a 7% tax on capital gains in excess of \$250,000, with exceptions, costing \$5,736,000,000 in its first ten years, for government spending.

This tax increase should be:

- Repealed
- Maintained

**Advisory Vote No. 38
Second Substitute Senate Bill 5315**

The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, a tax on captive insurers in the amount of 2% of premiums from owners/affiliates, costing \$53,000,000 in its first ten years, for government spending.

Proposition No. 1
Bonds to Construct New Fire Station**

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 12 (South Thurston Fire & EMS) adopted Resolution No. 2021-006, concerning bonds to finance a new fire station, vehicles and equipment. This proposition would authorize the District to: construct and equip a new 24-hour shift capable fire station to meet the South Thurston community's current and future emergency response needs; acquire a new fire engine, aid unit, pumper tender and land for the new station; issue no more than \$5,775,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2021-006.
