**Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 6 (East Olympia)
 Proposition No. 1
 Levy Lid Lift**

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 6 adopted Resolution No. 2020-02 concerning a proposition to restore the regular property tax levy. This proposition, if approved, would maintain district operations, in an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2021, and authorize setting the levy limit factor at 106% (not to exceed \$1.50 rate) for each of the following five years. The 2026 levy amount shall be used to calculate subsequent levy limits. Should this proposition be:
