Election Result Information

- On Election Day, the Logic and Accuracy test will begin at 7:00 a.m. followed by the first count of ballots, with a second count in the late afternoon. Printouts of election results will be available Election Night shortly after 8:00 p.m. with the first release of results.
- Additional counts will be conducted daily beginning at 4:00 p.m. (weekends and holidays excluded) as required by law.
- The final certification count will begin November 23, 2010 at 4:30 p.m.
- Updated results will be available each day after all processed ballots have been counted. Daily tabulation may be postponed if the Auditor's Office is not in possession of at least 500 valid, processed ballots at the scheduled time.

IMPORTANT CHANGE: The validation and 60% majority requirements for school district levies are no longer in place. School district levies now require a simple majority (50%+1) to pass, and have no required turnout percentages.

**Griffin School District No. 324
Technology and Capital Projects Levy
Proposition No. 1**

The Board of Directors of Griffin School District No. 324 adopted Resolution No. 09-10-13 concerning a capital and technology modernization levy. The proposition authorizes the modernization of facilities by implementing technology facilities and projects and the application and modernization of technology systems for operations and instruction and payments to Olympia School District for the expansion of Capital High School; and authorizes the following excess levies for such purposes on all taxable property within the District:
