Excess levies for schools require a simple majority to pass (50% +1); other jurisdictions require a 60% majority to pass and a minimum number of “Yes” votes cast equal to 24% of the total votes cast in the 2015 General Election.

Bonds require 60% majority, 40% validation, and a minimum number of approval votes cast based on the 2015 General Election in order to pass.

Levy lid lifts require a simple majority to pass (50% + 1).

**City of Olympia
Initiative No. 1**

Initiative Measure No. 1 concerns establishing and funding a college grant program.

This measure would establish a City of Olympia college grant program. City residents who graduate from public high school or receive a GED could receive grants for at least one year of community college tuition, or an equivalent sum to attend public colleges and universities in Washington. Grants would be funded by a 1.5% tax on household income above \$200,000, and also may be privately funded. Administrative expenses would be capped at 5%.
