

i Instructions



Marking Your Ballot

Use a dark pen. Vote for one. If you vote for more than one, that race or measure will not count. To vote for a candidate not on the ballot, print the name on the dashed line and fill in the oval to the left.



Making A Correction

Draw a line through the entire candidate's name or response. To vote for another candidate or response, fill in the oval to the left of your new selection.

Additional Information

Sign and date the voter's declaration on the return envelope.

For a replacement ballot, call the Thurston County Auditor's Office at 360.786.5408.

Return your ballot in a ballot drop box no later than 8:00 p.m. Election Day, or by mail (postmarked on or before Election Day).

**Yelm Community Schools
Proposition No. 1
Bonds to Improve Safety and Replace Schools**

The Board of Directors of Yelm Community Schools adopted Resolution No. 02-18-19, concerning a proposition to finance safety improvements and replace schools. This proposition would authorize the District to: make safety and security improvements at all schools, which will include control entry/access, security cameras, lighting and fencing; replace Yelm Middle School and Southworth Elementary School and remove portable classrooms from these schools; issue no more than \$98,985,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 02-18-19.

**Tanglewilde Parks and Recreation District
Proposition No. 1
Property Tax Levy**

The Board of Commissioners of Tanglewilde Parks and Recreation District adopted Resolution No. 1, concerning a proposition relating to the District's regular property tax levy. This proposition would impose regular property tax levies of \$0.60 or less per thousand dollars of assessed valuation for each of six consecutive years to pay part of the general expenses of the District.
