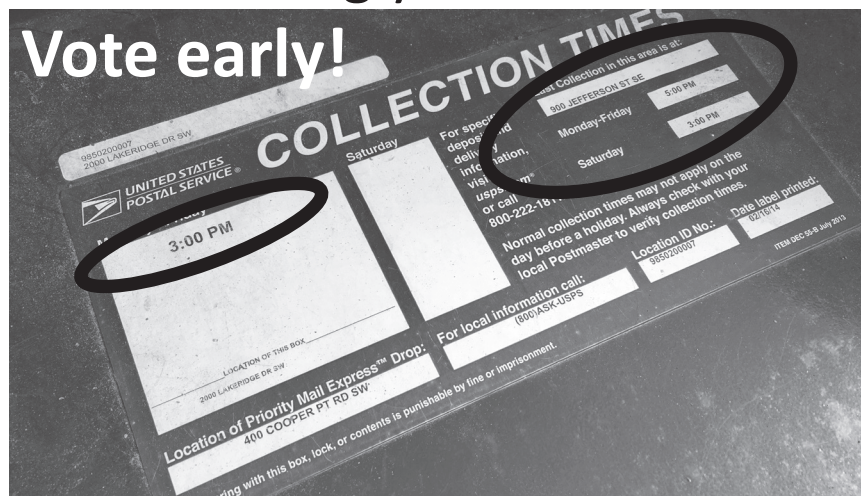

Thurston County Voter,



# Tanglewilde Parks and Recreation District No. 1 Proposition No. 1 Property Tax Levy

## Ballot Title

The Board of Commissioners of Tanglewilde Parks and Recreation District adopted Resolution No. 1, concerning a proposition relating to the District's regular property tax levy. This proposition would impose regular property tax levies of \$0.60 or less per thousand dollars of assessed valuation for each of six consecutive years to pay part of the general expenses of the District.

## Explanatory Statement

The Tanglewilde Parks and Recreation District has placed a levy on the February 12, 2019 Special Election ballot that would authorize a six-year levy for the district at a rate not to exceed \$0.60 per thousand dollars of assessed property value. This levy would allow the district to collect approximately \$65,000 per year for each of the next six years beginning in 2020. The district tax levy provides the funds for the maintenance and operation of the two parks and an outdoor pool facility within the Tanglewilde community. Using \$180,000 as an average home value in the district, the total tax levy at \$0.60 per thousand dollars of assessed property value would be \$108.00.

## For Statement

Vote to Keep Tanglewilde's Unique Parks and Pool for Generations to Come

Tanglewilde residents have operated two parks and a swimming pool almost since the inception of neighborhood in the late 1950's. Many residents have fond memories of taking their children and grandchildren down to the community park to play swim. Residents of Tanglewilde provide direct support to these park and recreational facilities through a levy. With the continued rapid growth of Lacey and surrounding Thurston County, Tanglewilde Parks and Pool provide a community option for gathering and recreation. A board of neighborhood volunteers uses *our* levy funds distributed by *our* elected commissioners to provide the required maintenance and operation of *our* facilities.

The renewal term of the park levy is 6 years. This levy will result in a tax of \$0.60 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation to provide not more than \$65,000 per year. The average property owner with a property value of \$180,000, will pay approximately \$108.00 dollars per year. The total will not exceed the maximum in each of the next five years. The levy will run from 2020 until 2026.

Please Vote *yes* for the Tanglewilde Parks and Pool Levy, and let's keep our facilities beautiful, safe and well maintained for the benefit of the residents of our community.
