

MEDIC ONE STAFF REPORT – APRIL 2021

ALS Update:

- For those eligible and looking for a vaccine, the State has a new tool called PrepMod for vaccine clinic searching and registration. Please visit the following site to access the clinics in our area: <https://prepmod.doh.wa.gov/> (As a pointer, it is easiest to search by the zip code “98501” for those in Thurston County)
- As Medic One searches for PPE from a variety of sources, what is issued through Alan and the Medic One cache may look different from that which we have traditionally supplied (i.e. black gloves instead of blue).
- Masking guidance has not been altered by L&I or Medic One with regards to vaccination status. Please remember that as more providers become vaccinated, the question will be posed as to whether or not masks are still required in the station and on scene. For at least the next several months, the answer to that question is “yes, masks are still required in the station and on scene.”

BLS Update:

- Spring 2021-1 EMT Course
 - The pre-requisite and orientation for the EMT Course was held on March 8th. The official classwork start was March 15th. The EMT Course will combine distributive and in-person learning and 11 students are enrolled.
- OTEP
 - The Instructor and Evaluator Workshops were completed on February 26th. A total of 3, one day workshops were completed for Evaluators and one 2-day workshop for new Instructors. Currently 3 of our new Instructors have signed up to participate with the Spring EMT Course.
 - The final OTEP Subjects will be available online by the beginning of April, 2021.

CPR Update:

- 82 citizens have been trained in Hands Only CPR as of March 22nd, 2021. Many thanks to all of our dedicated Instructors and staff who remain flexible and dedicated in training the citizens of Thurston County!
