Updated Artificial Tear Products Associated with Outbreak of Extensively Drug-resistant Pseudomonas aeruginosa

Action Requested:

- Immediately discontinue using EzriCare Artificial Tears and Delsam Pharma's Artificial Tears pending additional guidance from CDC and FDA.
- Advise patients who used EzriCare Artificial Tears or Delsam Pharma's Artificial Tears to immediately stop using these eye drops and monitor for signs and symptoms of infection. Patients with symptoms of eye infection are advised to seek medical care immediately.
- Place patients infected or colonized with extensively Drug-resistant Pseudomonas aeruginosa (Outbreak strain: VIM-GES-CRPA) and admitted to acute care settings in isolation and use Contact Precautions. For residents of skilled nursing facilities who are infected or colonized with VIM-GES-CRPA, use Enhanced Barrier Precautions if the resident does not have an indication for Contact Precautions.
- Report any carbapenem-resistant Pseudomonas aeruginosa (CRPA) from an ocular specimen or VIM-CRPA from any specimen source with collection dates since January 1, 2022, to Thurston County Public Health and Social Services (Communicable Disease Reporting Line: 360-786-5470 Fax: 360-867-2601) or email haioutbreak@cdc.gov for assistance submitting specimens. Ask your clinical laboratories to save these isolates for further characterization at public health laboratories.
- Clinical laboratories that identify any CRPA from an ocular specimen or VIM-CRPA from any specimen source should submit the isolate to the Antimicrobial Resistance Laboratory Network for further characterization. Background:

On February 3, 2023, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) identified a second brand of artificial tears Delsam Pharma's Artificial Tears associated with an outbreak of extensively drug-resistant Pseudomonas aeruginosa. CDC is collaborating with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and state and local health departments to investigate a multistate outbreak of an extensively drug-resistant strain of Pseudomonas aeruginosa. The outbreak strain, carbapenem-resistant Pseudomonas



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aeruginosa with Verona integron-mediated metallo- β -lactamase and Guiana extended-spectrum- β -lactamase (VIM-GES-CRPA), had never been reported in the United States prior to this outbreak. The outbreak is associated with multiple types of infections, including eye infections. The investigation to date has identified artificial tears as a common exposure for many patients.
