- © CDC and DOH issued alert on Johnson & Johnson vaccine and paused use
- 20,000 doses of COVID vaccine in Thurston County
- 153,623 doses to Thurston County residents
- 33.5% of Thurston County residents have received at least one dose
- 20% of Thurston County residents are fully vaccinated.
- April 15, 2021 ages 16 and up qualify for vaccine
- Outreach to citizens with linguistic, transportation, and other access barriers
- Numbers are of Thurston County residents, regardless of where or how received
- Will provide number of adverse reactions to flu shot
- Hopeful on community percentage of vaccination
