





Enrollments by type of project







Chronically Homeless at Project Entry Yes 11%



Data Narrative

- We have a very limited number of projects in Thurston County that qualify as Permanent or Permanent Supportive Housing; of those, even fewer require active homelessness for entry, which means they are not included in HMIS. This is why we see a higher percentage of exits into PH/PSH than we see folks entering these project types.
- The final 2022 Point in Time count data and report is still in process, and will be released this summer.

The data included below represents only the projects from each of these agencies that enter data into HMIS. It does not represent the sum of their program activities during this time period.
