## **ALS Update:**

- Medic One will be hosting another paramedic hiring process June 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. We will have postings up for the event by the 3<sup>rd</sup> week in May.
- ALS contract negotiations are currently underway between the Medic One team and the contracting agencies team.

# **BLS Update:**

- There are currently 16 students attending the EMT Course. 1 voluntarily dropped the course and 2 were dropped due to academics.
- Interviews have begun for the BLS Program Manager Position. Our first candidate was interviewed on April 22<sup>nd</sup> and two more will be interviewed on April 29<sup>th</sup>.
  The interview panel is comprised of Chiefs and Training Officers throughout the county and Medic One staff.
- OTEP
  - The Evaluator Workshops were held in March. Three dates were offered to accommodate EMS Personnel.
  - The new evaluator Process is underway. Curriculum has been developed and distributed to all Evaluators. Amy Johnson-Carpenter continues to arrange for mentorship for new Evaluators.

#### **CPR Update:**

 As of April 15th, 2022, 1,190 Thurston County Residents have completed Hands Only CPR Training. Our Training Team is meeting regularly to work on increasing in-person opportunities. Thank you to all of our Instructors and Fire Agencies for teaching and hosting these classes.

## IT Update:

- Medic One has started the purchasing of backlogged equipment orders. Supply-chain constraints continue to be an issue and are impacting delivery dates.
- Medic One has started the migration of cellular access contracts and fees from the Agencies to the Medic One budget as discussed at Medic One Operations and EMS Councils. Currently 25% completed and a work in progress.
