

TO: Applicants for Continuance in Open Space – Timber Land Classification

SUBJECT: Continuance in Current Use Process

The Timber Land Classification was created by the Legislature to encourage the continuous production of timber and forest products. This classification is for five (5) or more adjoining acres of land devoted to the growth and harvest of marketable timber.

The Assessor's Office cannot authorize continuance in Current Use classifications unless the fully completed and signed documents have been submitted and reviewed for approval or if being removed have prepared the removal cost. The Assessor's office requests the information be provided at least 15 working days prior to the transfer of ownership.

Continuance Application Process: Notice of Continuance forms are accepted any time of the year. Please be sure that all owners sign and date the application and include daytime phone numbers for each person. Return the completed Notice of Continuance, Timber Information Sheet and Timber Management Plan to the Assessor's Office.

Approval or Denial: Based upon the new owners fulfilling the above requirements and meeting the Timber Land Classification requirements outlined in RCW Chapter 84.34, the Assessor's Office will provide a determination in a timely manner. Please note: **Be sure new owners sign Section 6** (3) of the Real Estate Excise Tax Affidavit; otherwise, the continuance in the Current Use classification cannot be completed. If a continuance is denied, (1) the property must be removed from Current Use and (2) additional taxes, interest, and penalty must be paid before ownership can be transferred.

Forms required to be completed for the property to be continued:

- Notice of Continuance (Buyer/Grantee to complete)
- Timber Information Sheet, along with a Timber Management Plan (Buyer/Grantee to complete)
