

## **#1 - Thurston County Launched New Website March**



Have you visited our website recently? On March 1, the county launched a new, redesigned website. This is the county's first major website redesign in more than a decade. The county worked with a consulting company and used customer feedback collected in the first half of 2022 to complete the redesign. The new website has improved access to county services, created a consistent look across all county office and department pages, increased the county's brand recognition, and raised community engagement.

## **#2 - Thurston County Advances Electric Vehicles**



At a recent briefing, the Board of County Commissioners discussed the rapid growth of the electric vehicle (EV) market in Washington and the importance of EV adoption as a strategy to help meet the goals of the Thurston Climate Mitigation Plan. The board directed staff to develop a policy for EV chargers on county property and to pursue grant funding to help pay for the new infrastructure. This discussion builds upon work of the county's Central Services Department to add EVs to the county fleet. With the recent acquisition of its first all-electric pickup truck, a Ford F150 Lightning, and two more EVs on order, the county fleet will have seven EVs, five battery-electric and two plug-in hybrids. Staff are now preparing an application to the Washington Department of Commerce to fund public EV charging stations at the Southwest Washington Agricultural Business & Innovation Park in Tenino. Staff are also reviewing other state and federal grant programs and will return to the board with a draft county policy for charging infrastructure.
