THURSTON COUNTY POPULATION- HISTORICAL AND FORECASTING






Effects Of Growing 911 Volumes




THURSTON COUNTY EMS CALL VOLUME



12% Increase 2019 - 2021






Hospital Considerations




ED Visits Per Year






Length of Stay by Year








Medicaid Cases by Year
























Long-Term Care Facilities



Public Health and Social Services

As of 3/19/23:

- 10 COVID-19 outbreaks in congregate settings
 - 8 in long term care, 1 in a correctional facility and 1 in a shelter
- Total to date (3/19/23)
 - 362 COVID-19 outbreaks in congregate settings (LTCF, correctional, congregate housing – vast majority in LCTF)





Guidance Changes


- Shift in COVID-19 outbreak management from the facility level to the unit/wing level.
- The latest DOH Health Care COVID-19 guidance has removed quarantine except in rare circumstances (unable to mask, immunocompromised, etc.).
- PHSS issues guidance for enhanced mitigation measures which include quarantine of wing and holding admissions until there are 5 days of no new COVID-19 cases associated with the outbreak.
 If the facility has a plan for keeping new admissions to the wing in outbreak safe they may resume admissions before that time.






Providence Entryway Staffing:

TACOMA, Wash. — Today, MultiCare Health System broke ground on a new 10,000 emergency department located at 1055 Golf Club Road SE in Lacey.
