#1 - Commissioners Proclaim May as Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month

#2 - 2023 Point-in-Time Homeless Census Preliminary Data Released

POINT IN TIME PRELIMINARY DATA REPORT



The Point in Time Count is an effort to determine how many people are experiencing homelessness nationwide. The 2023 count was conducted on January 26th. Events, outreach, and direct provider engagement were the key avenues for survey distribution. A more detailed report will be released in June or July 2023.

This data represents an initial snapshot, and has not yet been verified by the Department of Commerce. The final data may be slightly lower than what is represented here.









The Point-in-Time Homeless Census (PIT) is an effort to count all people experiencing homelessness in Thurston County. Public Health and Social Services, Office of Housing and Homeless Prevention (OHHP) conducts the PIT count annually on the last Thursday in January. While the count represents a single night, the process of gathering information takes place over the course of the week, which includes conducting surveys, doing outreach, and holding events to drive engagement. The Homeless Management Information System, a database for homeless service providers across Washington, and a mix of surveys were used to conduct this year's count. The quality of data varies from year to year depending on methodology used, the weather, and other complications related to unsheltered homelessness. This year's PIT occurred on January 26, 2023. It collected data on individuals who are unsheltered (living outdoors), in emergency shelter, living in RVs/vehicles, or living in Transitional Housing. This is a preliminary count, so members of OHHP work in collaboration with the Department of Commerce to audit and confirm the list.

749 people have been included in the preliminary count, 323 of which slept out of doors or in their vehicle or RV. This year marked a dramatic shift from the previous two years, due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. During the PIT, events like two days of free laundry were provided to support various populations, including seniors, youth, and young adults. Each of these events provided opportunities to connect individuals to the survey, different service providers, community resources, incentives, and survival gear.

The PIT is a great opportunity for housed community members to volunteer and engage with the homeless community. Thurston County partnered with United Way, to bring in more than 60 volunteers across the different events. We expect the final report to be published by the end of May 2023.

Prairie Appreciation Day features guided walks and activities highlighting the ecology, history, and cultural significance of prairies.

Prairies are an essential part of the South Sound landscape. Some of the services they provide include:

- Supporting pollinators
- · Providing open space for birdwatchers and nature-walkers
- · Protecting nearby communities from wildfire
- · Sequestering carbon

They are also culturally significant to many Indigenous communities in the region who have long relied on prairies for food, medicine, and ceremony.

During Prairie Appreciation Day, attendees can learn about the history of prairies in the region, the challenges they face from development and invasive species, the ongoing efforts to protect and restore them, and what you can do on your property to support this rare ecosystem.

The event is organized by Friends of Puget Prairies and is a great opportunity for people of all ages to connect with nature and learn about the importance of preserving our natural heritage.
