






Enrollments by type of household













CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS percentage of distinct individuals who have enrolled in a housing project in 2023, as reported in HMIS.

Chronically Homeless at Project Entry





Data Highlights

- There was a new HMIS Coordinated Entry project that began this quarter, causing all individuals across the CE system to be entered again. As of the writing of this report, the project was about 90% complete.
- The number of individuals reporting any income has steadily increased over the past 3 years. Currently, 50% of individuals report any income, up from 29% and those that report receiving TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) has increased from 20% to 63%.

The data included below represents only the projects from each of these agencies that enter data into HMIS. It does not represent the sum of their program activities during this time period.
