

Food Safety Day

WHEREAS, the United Nations declared June 7th World Food Safety Day to draw global attention to the health consequences of contaminated food and water. With this year's theme being "Food Standards Save Lives" and

WHEREAS, Food safety has a direct impact on health, saves lives, and plays a vital role in reducing foodborne diseases like Listeria, E. Coli, or Salmonella; and

WHEREAS, every year, 600 million people fall sick because of around 200 different types of foodborne illnesses. The burden of such illness falls most heavily on the poor and the young. In addition, foodborne illness is responsible for 420,000 preventable deaths every year; and

WHEREAS in Washington State in 2021, there were 29 foodborne illness outbreaks that included 339 ill people, and Centers for Disease Control estimate almost 48 million people become ill and 3,000 people die from foodborne illnesses in the United States each year; and

WHEREAS, Everyone is a risk manager because safe food preparation begins at home with four basic steps;(1) keep food and surfaces and your hands clean, (2) keep raw meats and other foods apart, (3) cook foods to the proper temperature, and (4) put food away in the refrigerator right away; and

WHEREAS, over 1000 permitted food establishments in Thurston County provide meals and groceries to the public every day, working in partnership with local, state, and federal food safety inspectors to provide quality food in a safe fashion; and

WHEREAS, over 1000 permitted food establishments in Thurston County provide meals and groceries to the public every day, working in partnership with local, state, and federal food safety inspectors to provide quality food in a safe fashion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Health hereby proclaims **June** 7th, **2023, Food Safety Day** in Thurston County and calls upon all residents, communities, government agencies, faith groups, medical facilities, elected leaders, organizations, and businesses to make food safety a priority, raising food safety awareness and promoting collaboration across sectors.



PARK IMPACT FEES 2022 ANNUAL REPORT





