- Administered by the Thurston County Superior Court
- FRC is a problem- solving court program for parents with a substance use disorder whose children are in the dependency system due to a substantiated child abuse or neglect investigation.







PARADISE FOUND

- Implement Connexis CMS by end of 2022

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WIND IN YOUR SAILS

- Engaged FRC Team
- Participation with Heartstrides
- Transition of new FRC Case Coordinator who has extensive knowledge and background with FRC

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ANCHORS & ROCKS

- Recent challenges of appealing to people already in other treatment programs/facilities
- Access to clean & sober housing
- Impact of intimate partner violence on participant's engagement
- Lack of continuity with FRC Case Coordinator

EQUITY

- Offering participants the ability to appear for court via zoom or in person
- Trauma Informed Practices

WHAT ELSE?

- Attending National Drug Court Conference
- Program focusing on increasing census and modifying participant manual


















NURSE FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

Highlights

PARADISE FOUND

- Continuing to increase services for families by continued collaboration with partners (i.e., perinatal task force)
- Team stability- CQI project supporting mental health of staff and families.

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WIND IN YOUR SAILS

- Having 4 bilingual nurses and 1 bilingual support staff is helping the NFP program serve diverse populations
- More than 8 team members have an Infant Mental Health endorsement

TANCHORS & ROCKS

- The department's hiring process
- Having a licensed social worker on our NFP/FIN team would strengthen our support of families.

EQUITY

- Team discussions/activities to advance our knowledge, understanding of diversity, equity and inclusion

WHAT ELSE?

- Increased severity and amount of child abuse in the community

- FIN provides home and/ or telehealth visits, case management, and related services to individuals with qualifying behavioral health needs who are parents or caregivers of infants or young children.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASE COORDINATOR






- Administered by the Thurston County Superior Court
- The DV Case Coordinator provides monitoring, case coordination, and referrals in domestic violence cases. The DV Case Coordinator monitors compliance with court-ordered domestic violence treatment, including ensuring that individuals are assessed for mental health and substance use treatment and services where indicated by a licensed professional.




DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASE COORDINATOR














DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASE COORDINATOR





- Improve Compliance hearing attendance resulting in less frequent reviews per case.
- Increase current graduation/ successful exit rate.

WIND IN YOUR SAILS

- Increased communication with clients and providers.
- Implemented more detailed tracking of clients in March

ANCHORS & ROCKS

- Provider assessments are expensive and deter some individuals from fulfilling their orders.
- Non-Compliance and failure to appear for Review Hearings.

EQUITY

 Increase efforts to ensure strong communication with each Respondent. This can include more research into their community for resources as well as interpreter services or multi-language treatment options when needed.

WHAT ELSE?

I have found an online classroom-style option for treatment and assessments. This option covers the requirements and is more affordable for those who struggle to afford a standard provider. It also is a viable option for our respondents who have relocated to another state, where standards of treatment may differ. It is currently being reviewed by our Judges and we hope for a positive outcome!
