
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
#### WHAT IS TREATMENT SALES TAX?

The Treatment Sales Tax (TST) is a local funding stream that works alongside federal and state funding such as Medicaid to meet mental health and substance use needs in Thurston County, Washington. This 1/10th of 1% sales tax has been collected since 2009. Funds are spent on a variety of services including treatment courts, services at correctional facilities, community-based programs, and programs serving youth and families. Programs funded with TST aim to reduce justice involvement, emergency room use, health care costs, and public assistance.









#### **HOUSING STATUS & ZIP CODES**

## TREATMENT COURTS


#### WHAT IS A TREATMENT COURT?

Thurston County Treatment Courts operate to reduce the risk for future justice system involvement by connecting participants with appropriate support and services. This approach has been found to be more effective than traditional sentencing in holding individuals accountable, promoting positive behavior change, engaging participants with necessary support and services, providing continuous judicially and community supervision, and promoting community safety. TST funds are provided to operate activities of each Treatment Court, including the efforts of the Prosecuting Attorney's Office and the Public Defense.



**DUI Court** 


Drug Court	76 new clients were referred, 56% graduation rate
<b>DUI Court</b>	6 new clients were referred, 3 new client enrolled
Mental Health Court	57 new clients were referred, 67% graduation rate
Veterans Court	13 new clients were referred, 10 new clients enrolled

#### 2022 HIGHLIGHTS

Mental Health and Veterans Court was above capacity at the end of 2022, seeing caseload numbers similar to that before the COVID-19 pandemic. Caseload has been impacted by increases in screening, referrals, and acceptances into both programs as well as increases in needs and risk levels of participants.

Drug and DUI Court participants have returned to full in-person services with virtual hybrid options available to those on COVID-19 quarantine. Their focus in 2023 will be developing updated sanctions, incentives and therapeutic adjustments as well as continuing to build the census.

# **YOUTH & FAMILY PROGRAMS**



### PROGRAM PERFORMANCE

91% of clients exited successfully
92% of clients exited successfully, 154 referred to treatment
31% of clients exited successfully, 26% engaged in treatment
89% of clients exited successfully, 85% reported reduced anxiety at exit
33% of clients graduation rate, served at least 8 clients per quarter on average
72% of clients engaged in treatment, 76% reported improved mental health
90% of clients graduated, 100% reported improved mood disturbance
95% of clients exited successfully, 80% reported improved parenting skills
90% of clients exited successfully, 82% reported improved mental health
81% of clients exited successfully, 85% showed reduced suicide risk
41% of clients exited successfully, 50% reported improved school attendance
55% of clients exited successfully, 50% overall reduction in alcohol use

### 2022 HIGHLIGHTS


In 2022, the Transition Aged Youth Wraparound with Intensive Services (TAY-WISe) program was launched. The program serves youth and young adults aged 15 through 20 years old at high risk for criminal justice involvement due to complex problem behaviors and/or mental illness.

JJBHA's participants involved in Youth Development have been doing community service at the court's Garden Project, the Thurston County Food Bank, HeartStrides Therapeutic Horsemanship, Sprout Farm, Gateways and other events and activities. In just the last quarter of 2022, JJBHA youth completed over 200 hours of community service.


#### PROGRAM PERFORMANCE

Chemical Dependency Program (CDP)	100% of Thurston County Jail clients graduated
Preparing for Re-Entry Employment	18 clients gained employment, served at least 17 clients per quarter on average
Psych ARNP Prescriber	323 clients were referred, average wait time of 6 days for services
Jail Behavioral Health Program	3,326 mental health interventions were conducted

### **2022 HIGHLIGHTS**

The COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact programs in 2022, however many of them found ways to provide services in a limited capacity, including virtual modalities. Programs recruited for more staff as shortages made it difficult to offer full services throughout the year.

The Transitions and Medication Management as well as the Thurston County Corrections Re-Entry Assistance programs were transitioned to TMBHASO oversight after June of 2022. Those program services are now being provided through the Jail Behavioral Health program.

Public Defense Social Services	67% of clients exited successfully, 30% engaged in treatment on average
Veterans Case Manager	100% of clients linked to treatment and housing at exit
Houseless Population Crisis Support (New in 2022!)	30 referrals to the program, 71% of clients referred to other services
Thurston County Sheriff's Office Co-Responder (New in 2022!)	263 referrals to the program, 45% of clients referred to other services
Resource Hub (New in 2022!)	183 onsite visits, 49 remote visits

#### 2022 HIGHLIGHTS

The Resource Hub program was launched in 2022, operated by Thurston County Pretrial Services at the County Courthouse Complex. Through collaboration with many partners and community providers, the Hub has been able to provide referrals to behavioral health assessment or treatment, education or employment, housing, public benefits, healthcare, legal support, water, food, clothing, hygiene kits, toys for children and more.

- Expanded TST community grants, including partnerships with new agencies
- Supported launch of new TST-funded programs
- Coordinated trainings programs and partners, including Lunch & Learn series, evening community forums with NAMI and Justice Not Jails, and Motivational Interviewing training
- Onboarded new data analyst and 2 new TST Advisory Committee members
- Launched bimonthly jail re-entry service provider coordination group
- Worked with all TST-funded programs to establish Diversity, Equity and Inclusion goals
- Hosted discussions of goals, progress and barriers between TST-funded programs and TST Advisory Committee
- Worked with the **Equity Institute** to create relational and operational community agreements for the TST **Advisory Committee**

#### **2023 GOALS**

- Welcome and orient new members of the TST Advisory Committee
- Complete budget process in Summer of 2023 for the 2024-2025 biennium
- Complete 2024-2025 Community Grant RFP process
- Continue many 2022 activities above
