#1 - What's in our Waste? The Thurston County Solid **Waste Division Found Out**



What's in our waste? The Solid Waste Division found out. Working with a consulting company, the division studied the contents of our garbage, recycling, and organics from 2022 to 2023.

What we found

By sorting samples into 42 categories, we learned organics (food and yard waste) make up 23 percent of residential curbside garbage. That equals roughly 104 million pounds per year! Food waste alone was 15.6 percent of our household garbage, or 70.2 million pounds per year.


