NOTICE OF MEETING OF THE THURSTON COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

Notice is hereby given that the Thurston County Board of Equalization will convene for the 2023 assessment year at 11:00 AM on Thursday, August 24, 2023, and will continue in session and adjourn from time to time for a period of not less than three (3) days, and not to exceed twenty-eight (28) days. Meetings will be held at 11:00 AM on Thursday, August 31, 2023, Thursday, September 7, 2023, and Tuesday, September 12, 2023, and at other times as required, to publicly examine and equalize the assessments extended into the current year on the taxable property of said county, for taxes to be levied in the year 2024 and to correct all errors in valuation, description, or qualities of property assessed by the Assessor. Interested persons may attend business meetings of the Board of Equalization in person or telephonically. Meeting agendas are posted on the Board's website.

The owner or agent of any taxable property who feels there are inequities in their assessments or exemptions may file a petition and appear before the Board at the time and place appointed. Appeal forms may be acquired from the Board's website at <https://www.thurstoncountywa.gov/departments/board-equalization> or in person at the Board of Equalization's office, located in the Atrium at 3000 Pacific Avenue SE, Room 244, in Olympia, Washington. You may also request petition forms by contacting the Clerk of the Board of Equalization at (360) 786-5135, TDD 711 or 1-800-833-6388, or by sending e-mail to ruth.elder@co.thurston.wa.us. Taxpayers are encouraged to make an appointment.

Properly completed petition forms must be postmarked or received in the Board's office on July 1, 2023, or within sixty days after the date that an assessment or value change notice has been mailed by the County Assessor, whichever date is later. The Board shall not consider improperly completed appeals or appeals not made on the petition form. Petition forms must be postmarked by the US Postal Service or received by the Board of Equalization by the filing deadline. Appeals postmarked or received subsequent to the filing deadline may be denied on the grounds that they were not timely filed.
