ADMIN and ALS Update:

- The Paramedic Program Manager position will be filled starting on January 2nd, 2024! We welcome Juan Mejias to our team, and we look forward to introducing him to the system in the coming months.
- No new candidates were added to the Medic One paramedic hiring list after the last round of testing. We will be conducting testing again on January 10-11, 2024, as well as April 10-11, 2024.
- The Board of County Commissioners has preliminarily passed the Medic One budget as recommended by the EMS Council this summer.

BLS Update:

- EMT Class is nearing completion with Graduation set for Monday 12/18 at SPSCC
- We've received the LifePak1000 AEDs and we are still awaiting delivery of the LifePak1000 trainers. Once we have a trainer ETA, we will work on rollout of the new devices.
- We are currently updating all of the EMT Class policies and procedures as part of a workgroup chartered by the Operations Committee. We will be presenting our recommendation to the Operations Committee in January.
- We are currently planning the 2024 Evaluator Workshop, which is slated for January 21st, 23rd, 24th, and 25th

CPR Update:

• A total of 2,418 citizens have been trained in hands-only CPR through October.

IT Update:

- The way Patient Dispositions in ESO Changes will be taking effect County wide June 28th
 @ 0700, this change is a part of the NEMSIS 3.5 data standard.
- TCERN Radio installations in all Medic Units have been completed, M1 Admin vehicles are still awaiting portables.
- Purchasing costs are still being impacted by vendor increases from various economic and supply issues.
