1: A representative season can b	e determined by the Environmental H	lealth Division using:		
<ul> <li>a. The storm events defined in these policies.</li> <li>b. The total accumulated rainfall in the rainy season defined in these policies.</li> <li>c. The patterns of the rainfall precipitation totals for each-month in the defined rainy season. Rainfall patterns can be determined by using data from National Weather Service Forecast Office, Olympia Station.</li> <li>d. The field results obtained during the study period.</li> </ul>				
2. Rainfall that maintains an average precipitation total for each month during the rainy season can be considered a representative season. Rainy Season is December through March.				
3. Rainfall that does not maintain an average precipitation total for December through March can be evaluated to determine a representative season by:				

- a. Using a combination of site-specific physical characteristics and the soil profile.
- b. Evaluating the rainfall data to determine if the soil hydrologic response has been adequately addressed. See ONST.20.GUI.843.
- 4. The protocol listed in 3 shall not be applied to a Wet Season Study for deep trench systems or surface water.
- 5. In the event it is a non-representative season. the applicant may re-submit an application with applicable fees the next wet season study.
