Who is required to compost?

Business Organics Management Law began January 1

In 2022, the Washington State Legislature passed the Organics Management Law to reduce the amount of methane created when food and yard (organic) waste decomposes in a landfill. The law set specific targets based on 2015 levels to achieve a significant reduction in this greenhouse gas to meet the state's climate goals. Starting in January, this law impacts businesses in Thurston County.

Business Impacts

Based on the volumes of organic and solid waste produced, businesses must comply with the law following the schedule below:

- Jan. 1, 2024 - Businesses generating at least **eight cubic yards of organic waste per week** must arrange for organic materials management.
- Jan. 1, 2025 - Businesses generating at least **four cubic yards of organic waste per week** must arrange for organic materials management.
- Jan. 1, 2026 - Businesses generating at least **four cubic yards of solid waste per week** must arrange for organic materials management.
