In person: May 6 through May 10, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Thurston County Elections Division

### Position Descriptions - Local

### **County Commissioner**

### **Position Description**

County commissioners set the budget for the county, adopt and repeal county ordinances, and serves on boards and commissions such as the Intercity Transit Authority, the Thurston County Parks Board and the Chehalis Basin Partnership.

### Qualifications

Candidates must be registered voters and residents of their district at the time of filing (RCW 29A.24.075).

### **For Your Consideration**

- In the Primary Election, only voters within the district may vote for the candidates.
- In the General Election, all voters in the county may vote on the county commissioner positions.

### **Public Utility District Commissioner**

### **Position Description**

A Public Utility District (PUD) commissioner establishes PUD policies, sets utilities rates, adopts plans for electric and water utilities, and sets the budget.

### Qualifications (RCW 54.12.010)

Candidates must be registered voters and residents of their district at the time of filing (RCW 29A.24.075).

### **For Your Consideration**

- In the Primary Election, only voters within the district may vote for the candidates.
- In the General Election, all voters in the county may vote on the PUD commissioner position.

### **Precinct Committee Officer**

### **Position Description**

A Precinct Committee Officer (PCO) is a partisan elected official who links a political party to the voters in a precinct. A PCO may conduct voter registration, lead "get out the vote" efforts, distribute campaign and party information, promote the party, and address voter concerns.

### Qualifications

Candidates must be a registered voter and reside in the precinct at the time of filing.

### **For Your Consideration**

• If only one person files for office, he or she is deemed elected.

### Only contested PCO races in the same party will appear on the ballot.

- If no one files for office, the position will be filled by the county central committee of the appropriate political party.
- No special three-day filing period is allowed for vacancies.
- Write-in candidates are not permitted.
- The PCO term is two years, running from December 1, 2024 through November 30, 2026.

PCO candidate information will not appear in the local voters' pamphlet.

### New for 2024:

17 year olds who will be 18 by the Primary Election may file for PCO before their 18th birthday.

### How to file in Thurston County

Thurston County prefers candidates file electronically at ThurstonWAVotes.gov. For mail and in-person candidate filing, visit the Elections Division (address below).

#### Requirements

- Be a registered voter of the district and meet the residency requirements for the office you are filing for.
- Pay filing fee by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, cash, check, or filing fee petition (see next page).
- Your name will not appear on any official list as a candidate for office until your Declaration of Candidacy is approved and your filing fee is paid.
- Provide an email address.

# Candidates Collecting Signatures in Lieu of a Filing Fee RCW 29A.24.091, 101, 111

Candidates may submit a filing fee petition in lieu of filing fee.

- The petition must be presented with the Declaration of Candidacy.
- The form is available on the Elections Division website: ThurstonWAVotes.gov under Candidates & Jurisdictions.
- The form must contain one valid, registered voter signature for each dollar of the filing fee. For example, if the filing fee is \$421.06, the petition must contain 421 valid signatures of registered voters in the district/jurisdiction of the office you are seeking.
- Gather extra signatures to allow for invalid ones. You can't submit additional signatures if you don't meet the number needed.
- No signatures may be submitted after Fri, May 10, 2024 at 5 p.m.
- Petitions cannot be combined with money for the filing fee.

# Write-in Candidates RCW 29A.24.311

### **Declaration of Candidacy for Write-in Candidates**

Primary:

July 18, 4:30 p.m. - No filing fee August 6, 8:00 p.m. - Must pay filing fee

General:

October 17, 4:30 p.m. - No filing fee November 5, 8:00 p.m. - Must pay filing fee

Candidate Order on Ballot RCW 29A.36.131, 170

In the Primary Election, candidate order on the ballot is determined by random lot draw. Then, the candidate with the most votes in the Primary Election is listed first on the General Election ballot. If there isn't a primary, the lot drawing conducted at the end of filing week will be the order on the ballot for the General.

# **Voters' Pamphlet Information**

The deadline to submit Voters' Pamphlet information for the Primary and General Elections is **Tuesday, May 21, 2024 at 5 p.m.** Send your statement and photo as early as possible.

The pamphlet provides an opportunity for candidates to publish a current photo, statement and campaign information.

If you experience technical problems, call the Elections Division immediately. **Technical difficulties will not excuse candidates from meeting the deadline.** Thurston County publishes an official pamphlet for every election.

### Guidelines: Voting Center & Ballot Drop Boxes

RCW 29A.84.510 Acts prohibited in voting center (1) During the voting period that begins eighteen days before and ends the day of a special election, general election, or primary, no person may:

- (a) Within a voting center or student engagement hub or in any public street or room in any public manner within 100 feet measured radially from the entrance to a voting center or student engagement hub or 25 feet measured radially from a ballot drop box as described in RCW 29A.40.170:
- (i) Suggest or persuade or attempt to suggest or persuade any voter to vote for or against any candidate or ballot measure;
  - (ii) Circulate cards or handbills of any kind;
  - (iii) Solicit signatures to any kind of petition; or
- (iv) Engage in any practice which interferes with the freedom of voters to exercise their franchise or disrupts the administration of the voting center;
- (b) Engage in any activities restricted under (a) of this subsection through electronic amplification located more than 100 feet from an entrance to a voting center or student engagement hub or 25 feet from an entrance to a ballot drop box if the person is capable of being understood within 100 feet of the voting center or student engagement hub or 25 feet of the ballot drop box;
- (c) Obstruct the doors or entries to a building in which a voting center or ballot drop location is located or prevent free access to and from any voting center or ballot drop location.
- (2) The auditor shall post a sign at the point or points specified at each voting center as required by RCW 29A.40.160 during the voting period providing notice of the prohibition in subsection (1)(a) of this section.
- (3) Any sheriff, deputy sheriff, or municipal law enforcement officer shall stop the prohibited activity, and may arrest any person engaging in the prohibited activity.
- (4) Any violation of this section is a gross misdemeanor, punishable to the same extent as a gross misdemeanor that is punishable under RCW 9A.20.021, and the person convicted may be ordered to pay the costs of prosecution.

(5) Nothing in this section may be construed to limit or otherwise restrict the access of an authorized political party observer to a voting center, student engagement hub, or ballot drop box for the purpose of observing the election process.

### RCW 29A.84.540 Ballots - Removing from voting center or ballot drop box location.

"Any person who, without lawful authority, removes a ballot from a voting center or ballot drop location is guilty of a class C felony punishable to the same extent as a class C felony that is punishable under RCW 9A.20.021."

### RCW 9.41.284 - Possessing dangerous weapons at voting facilities

Weapons are prohibited in the ballot processing center. No weapon, whether concealed or openly carried, may be possessed in any ballot counting center or areas of facilities while being used as a ballot counting center. Weapons are restricted at the voting centers. This restriction does not prohibit concealed carry of a pistol, by a person licensed to carry a concealed pistol pursuant to RCW 9.41.070, in any voting center, student engagement hub, county elections and voter registration office, or areas of facilities while being used as a voting center, student engagement hub, or county elections and voter registration office.

#### **Campaign Materials**

Campaign materials cannot be placed in or on top of mailboxes without paying postage, nor should campaign materials be placed in newspaper delivery tubes. (18 U.S. Code § 1725)
