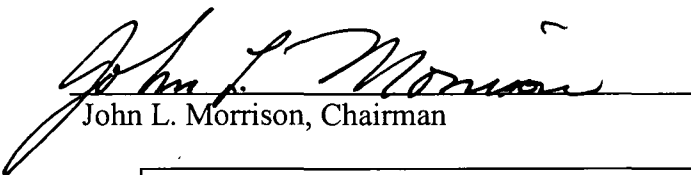

This decision is based on our finding that: The Board adopts the Assessor's recommended reduction based on the evidence presented. The Parties did not participate in the hearing. On Petition, the Petitioners provided four comparable sales in support of their requested value. The Assessor's Representative provided a written Response including a market-adjusted cost approach and a sales comparison approach in support of the recommended value. The Assessor recommended a reduction in the value of the improvements to \$308,800, for a total recommended value of \$380,000. The Board finds that the reasons for the recommended reduction are not manifest error corrections pursuant to Revised Code of Washington 84.48.065(1)(a), so the standard of review is reduced from clear, cogent, and convincing to the preponderance of the evidence. The Board finds that the comparable sales presented by both Parties support the recommended reduction. The Board concludes that the Petitioners did not provide the preponderance of the evidence to warrant a further reduction in the valuation.
