Updated Long-Term Care Facility COVID-19 Guidance and New Phone Number for COVID-19 Support for Long-Term Care Facilities

Actions Requested:

- 1) Quarantine all new admissions to your facility for 14 days regardless of vaccination status. Quarantine all new admissions for 14 days in either a single room or a separate observation area. During this observation period full PPE including N95 or higher respirator, eye protection, gown and gloves must be used. Test for Sars-CoV-2 if symptoms develop or if there is a new exposure.
- 2) Perform routine testing of staff regardless of vaccination status. Test positivity rates from the preceding week are to be used to determine cadence for screening testing and can be found in section titled "COVID-19 Testing" at https://data.cms.gov/covid-19/covid-19-nursing-home-data. Facility Type	Recommended/Required	County Positivity Rate/ Testing Cadence
<i>Nursing Facilities Skilled Nursing Facilities</i>	Required by <u>CMS QSO-</u> <u>20-38-NH</u> and Washington State Department of Health	<5% - Once a month 5-10% - Once a week >10% - Twice a week□
Assisted Living Facilities	Required by Thurston County Public Health	<5% - Once a month >5% - Once a week
Supported Living Facilities Adult Family Homes	Recommended if resources are available	<5% - Once a month >5% - Once a week

3) Call 360-968-4066 for Thurston County COVID-19 support for long-term care facilities. Thurston County has a new phone number for long-term care facilities to use to report new cases and COVID-19 exposures and to reach the Outbreak Team. It is answered between 8am and 5pm seven days a week. If you need to report a case at other times, you can leave a message on the secure communicable disease reporting line by calling 360-786-5470.



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Background:

Thurston County is currently experiencing a surge in cases due to the delta variant. The delta variant is a strain of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that is more readily transmissible than previous strains and has become the dominant variant in Washington State. People who are fully vaccinated can become infected with this variant and spread the disease to others. Vaccination is highly effective at preventing severe illness and death from COVID-19 and reduces the risk of infection. There have been instances of newly admitted fully vaccinated individuals in long-term care facilities testing positive for COVID-19 in Thurston County. Individuals with medical comorbidities are at increased risk of severe disease and death from COVID-19 infection. COVID-19 can spread rapidly in long-term care facilities. There has been 76 COVID-19 outbreaks in long-term care facilities in Thurston County since the pandemic began.
