Group A Public Water Systems: Thurston County Building Development Center staff reviews the water system adequacy report provided by the Washington State Department of Health Office of Drinking Water and recommends approval of the COWA if the requirements to demonstrate water availability are met.

Group B Public Water Systems: Thurston County Environmental Health staff evaluates the public water system records to determine whether the proposed connection is within the scope of system approval, and if the system is in compliance with water quality monitoring and other operational requirements. Environmental Health staff will recommend whether or not COWA should be approved. Building Development Center staff approves the COWA if the requirements to demonstrate water availability are met.
