A presentation will be given at this meeting beginning at 6:30 PM. The purpose of this meeting is for Thurston County Community Planning staff to distribute information to the community regarding a consultant literature review conducted as part of a proposed policy change. The proposed policy change would amend a single policy within the Nisqually Subarea Plan to remove language that currently prohibits asphalt reprocessing (recycling) within the subarea.
