There are three (3) documented archaeological sites within one (1) mile of the parcels and another five (5) when you expand to two (2) miles; the only way to determine any adverse impacts to cultural resources is through a thorough investigation of the parcels in question. Please keep us informed if there are any Inadvertent Discoveries of Archaeological Resources/Human Burials.
