The Treatment Sales Tax (TST) is a local funding stream that works alongside federal and state funding such as Medicaid to meet mental health and substance use needs in Thurston County. Through reduced justice involvement, emergency room use, health care costs, and public assistance and increased earnings, **TST programs save our community approximately \$4 for every \$1 spent.**

A volunteer Advisory Committee comprised of Thurston County residents makes non-binding recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners regarding use of TST funds.

Reduce criminal justice involvement for individuals with behavioral health needs, including jail diversion and reducing recidivism
