

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
FOR THE THURSTON COUNTY PLANNING
COMMISSION**

The Thurston County Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on June 2, 2021, at 7:00 p.m., or soon thereafter. The hearing shall be held virtually. The Planning Commission will provide a link to connect remotely to the public hearing for those interested in providing testimony, posted one week before the public hearing online at: <https://www.thurstoncountywa.gov/planning/Pages/pc-meetings.aspx>.

The purpose of the hearing is to accept public comment on a minor amendment to the 2021-2026 Thurston County Capital Improvement Program (CIP) concurrent with the county budget amendment process. The CIP is Appendix G of the Thurston County Comprehensive Plan. It is part of the county's capital facilities element, required under the Growth Management Act. The CIP is a 6-year financing plan for capital facilities. Two new facilities are proposed to be added to this plan for purposes of housing county administrative offices.

The Planning Commission may make a recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners on the proposal during this time, or any scheduled meeting thereafter.

Those wishing to testify should connect remotely to the virtual public hearing and be heard. If unable to attend, mailed and emailed comments must be received by June 2, 2021, by 4:00 pm.
